# 10:45 - 11:45 AM Intervention Strategies to Reduce Risk of Infectious Disease.

# Description:

Inanimate objects or fomites play an important role in the transmission of many common infectious diseases. Recent research on the use of tracer viruses has allowed us to assess the speed at which viruses can spread in indoor environments, such as offices, hotels, homes and health care environments. Using this approach various interventions (hand sanitizers, disinfecting wipes, etc.) have been conducted to quantify the reduction in risk of infection in these environments. This presentation will review the new insights these studies have provided and which interventions provide the greatest risk reduction of infectious disease transmission.
