A New Vision for Arizona's OWTF Regulation

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Current State

Estimate: 600,000 systems in Arizona



Systems are 50+ Years Old

- 115,000 built prior to 1970
- Approximately 30,000 75,000 cesspools (outlawed 1976)

According to EPA, one of the top 3 causes of groundwater contamination are old and non operational systems.

Current permitting structure limits innovation



Permitting bottlenecks due to lack of clarity in the rule

Inability to **check** if the system is performing as designed

Limitations on using recycled water

PPL evaluation process is inconsistent

Lack of information on current systems statewide

Transfer inspection reports are inconsistent

Homeowner Problems (2023 Survey)



46% have systems older than 20 years

38% have had a problem with the system

72% **bought home** with existing system

- 67% were inspected
- 49% received the report
- 60% were pumped
- 21% received permit and maintenance records

Numerous complaints about fraudulent inspections



Real Estate Agent Problems



Realtors' Requests to Fix Program

2023 Survey (535 Responses)

- Certification of inspectors
- Easy online access to system records statewide
- State funding to help low income families with repairs
- Clarity on when a system is considered operational



RV and Mobile Home Parks' Problems



- Many located in remote areas without sewer
- Large flow volumes require an individual permit
- Monitoring and financial requirements are cost prohibitive
- Takes longer to get a permit



County Staff Problems

- 22 permits to manage
- Lack of permitting clarity
- Confusing permitting processes
- Lack of enforcement

Advanced Treatment Products



- ADEQ to monitor performance
- No change for existing systems
- Needs statutory change



Protect Homeowners

- Ensures the professionals inspecting, installing and servicing systems are trained
- Needs statutory change

Establishment of State Funding for Replacement of Cesspools and Leaking Tanks



Move out of Aquifer Protection Rule

- Simplifies regulation for RV and mobile home parks and commercial facilities
- No change for existing systems
- Needs statutory change

Establishes online state database

- Easier access to records for real estate agents and homeowners
- No change for existing systems

Simplify General Permits

- Reduce number of permits from 22 to 3
- Eliminates multiple permits per site
- Renewable discharge permit (5 years)
- No change for existing systems

- Triggers when existing systems will be impacted
- At time of property sale
- Replacement of existing system
- Changes to structure requiring a building permit

- At Time of Property Sale
- System is operational
- Inspector is certified
- Online records search

STATUTORY AUTHORITY NEEDED

ADEQ Arizona Department of Environmental Quality

- Move program out of APP
- Provide authority to issue permits and 5 year operating certificate
- Create a license for proprietary products
- Establish a certification program
- Update other sections of statute
